2021 PATIO FEES WAIVED

It was announced on March 10th that to help support local businesses, the City of North Bay will again be waiving all fees associated with the creation of new or expanded outdoor patio spaces for the 2021 season. First implemented in 2020, waiving of the fees again this year was approved by North Bay City Council Tuesday. This includes any potential building permit fees, applicable parking fees under the existing Sidewalk Patio Program and municipal alcohol license approvals and extensions issued through the City Clerk's Office for the 2021 season. In addition, the existing Sidewalk Patio Program in the Downtown will again be expanded to support the use of sidewalks for outdoor retail space.

Guidelines developed by the City to assist local businesses in the creation of new or expanded outdoor patio spaces, including information about when a permit may be required are available here.

GIFT CERTIFICATES

In 2020, the Board of Management put a total of \$30,000 into our Bonus Dollars gift card program. With each \$50 gift card purchase, customers received a bonus \$25 gift card. In total, \$90,000 was diverted from big box stores, and moved to Downtown.



GROWTH COMMUNITY INCENTIVE PROGRAM (GCIP)

The City's new Growth Community Incentive Program is designed to help grow the community through city wide programming for industrial development and targeted intensification for housing and downtown waterfront commercial projects with a number of financial incentives. An application for any financial incentive program contained in this CIP:

- i) Can be made only for development, redevelopment, rehabilitation, and/or adaptive reuse of a building or property within the identified target areas of this CIP;
- ii) Must be submitted to the City prior to the commencement of any works to which the incentive program will apply and prior to the application for a building permit; and
- iii) Must include plans, drawings, studies, reports, cost and/or other studies, details and information as may be required by the City to satisfy the City with respect to project eligibility, design, performance and conformity with the CIP.
