• Tourism and Travel Small Business Support Grant

The Ontario government is providing one-time payments of \$10,000 to \$20,000 to support eligible small tourism and travel businesses struggling to recover from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. This grant will support eligible small tourism and travel businesses that did not receive the Ontario Small Business Support Grant (OSBSG), such as travel agents, hotels, motels, resorts, and bed and breakfasts. To qualify, businesses must have fewer than 100 employees and demonstrate they have experienced a minimum 20 per cent revenue decline between 2019 and 2020. DETAILS HERE

Restaurant & Bar Support Fund

The Restaurant & Bar Support Fund has been launched to provide one-time grants to financially assist food and beverage establishments throughout Ontario. Their target is to raise \$5 million to assist a minimum of 1,000 Ontario food and beverage businesses through 2021. <u>DETAILS HERE</u>
