

# ONTARIO INTRODUCES VACCINE PASSPORTS

As of September 22, Ontarians will be required to show their vaccine receipt when entering designated settings along with another piece of photo identification, such as a driver's licence or health card. This approach focuses on higher-risk indoor public settings where face coverings cannot always be worn and includes:

- Restaurants and bars (excluding outdoor patios, as well as delivery and takeout);
- Nightclubs (including outdoor areas of the establishment);
- Meeting and event spaces, such as banquet halls and conference/convention centres;
- Facilities used for sports and fitness activities and personal fitness training, such as gyms, fitness and recreational facilities with the exception of youth recreational sport;
- Sporting events;
- Casinos, bingo halls and gaming establishments;
- Concerts, music festivals, theatres and cinemas;
- Strip clubs, bathhouses and sex clubs;
- Racing venues (e.g., horse racing).





# NEW STAT HOLIDAY FOR FEDERALLY REGULATED INDUSTRIES


The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation will be observed on September 30th beginning in 2021 and every calendar year thereafter. This new statutory holiday only applies to federally regulated employers subject to the Canada Labour Code.

For purposes of clarity, federally regulated industries include, but are not limited to, banks, air and railway transportation, radio and television broadcasting, and telephone and cable systems. For everyone else, it's business as usual.
